1. Download the latest Notepad++ release here: https://notepad-plus-plus.org/download/v6.7.8.2.html

Note: These instructions may not apply to older versions of Notepad++

- 2. Install Notepad++ with the default settings. (Don't check any boxes or change anything)
- 3. Open Notepad++

NOTE: Configuration settings take effect simply by entering them, most often there is no "Save", "Apply" or "Ok".

4. As shown below, turn on auto complete:

Settings->Preferences->Auto-completion Check enable auto completion on each input Check Word completion Enter 3 in the "From the th character" Note: there is no "save" just close it.

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5. Click on the link below to download a zip file containing the plc and cnc configuration files.

6. If using Notepad++ to compile PLC programs, extract the files from notepad++files.zip into the cncm or cnct directory created when you installed CNC11. If your will not be compiling PLC programs, unzip the files into the directory of your choice and proceed to step 7. If you are compiling PLC programs and are running Mill software, rename c:\cncm\compile-mill.txt to compile.cmd If you are running Lathe software, rename c:\cnct\compile-lathe.txt to compile.cmd

7. Select Language->Define you Language->Import and navigate to the directory that you extracted the files in notepad++files.zip to. Now import cnc.xml and plc.xml (one at a time). (below)

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8. As shown below, select Settings->Preferences->File Associations-customize. One at a time, type the following extensions into the box (#1) - cnc, src, plc, mac and txt, and then press the arrow (#2) Note: There no need to add the period "." before the file extension, it is added automatically. Press "Close" when finished. If you will not be compiling PLC programs, Notepad++ configuration is complete
